This Year Can Be Different

Every New Year's there is a huge push to do a makeover. To fix ourselves. To motivate ourselves. To make ourselves better. To read more books. To workout. To attend the Holy. To find "our word" and live it. Our culture screams- "A newer you is a better you."

Bah-humbug!

Why can't this year be different because we have been to the manger and witnessed the birth that changed all others? Why can't we put down striving and pick up this newborn that God has placed in our laps, called us by name, and asked us to simply love? To simply love God beholding us and as we behold God in ourselves, in God's people, and in God's creation. Why can't this year be different?

So, what would that look like for you? What can you put down? Simplify? Let go of? What can be different for you because you are a child of God? "Precious, honored and oh so loved?" What can be different for you? Name it. Sit with it. Ponder it. Discuss it with God.

This is what we learn again and again each Advent, and it is something we carry into every season of the new year.

This year can be different. Talk to God about how. Then let God speak. Ponder it. Receive it. Savor it as a gift. And for once, know that you are "loved, loved, loved," so you don't have to "strive, strive, strive." No fixing this year. No improvements. No New Year's Eve resolutions. Let this year be different because you are a precious Child of God. Nothing extra is needed. Except maybe, to see it, and honor it and to behold the incarnate God in you. That is glorious enough.

Prayer for this New Year—

God, of new beginnings, we come to the start of this new year still starstruck at the manger, wondering how we can claim the love that claims us here. We feel so unworthy of your goodness and yet you became human to show us that we are inherently good, and that we belong to you. We want to believe that you live inside of us, that you are incarnate, but we are afraid to look, afraid of being disappointed. Help us to know, even where we doubt, that your gift is within to be savored and shared. Nudge our reservations to the sidelines so we might cohabit with the awe of being prized by you. Let this new year be the start of receiving your love and radiating it by naming our particular gifts and offering them back to you. Let this year be different because we have been to the manger and know "what child is this," that we too, are beheld by Love beholding us. For we pray this in the name of the One who was born to free us from our smaller selves, and who is and was and always will be our Christ, Amen.

Linda co-led the Worship and Education Team and chaired the Personnel Committee and Carolyn co-led the Worship and Ed Team her first year and co-chaired the Member Care and Mission Team, her second. They both said, "YES!" to God and their hard work and love for God were inspirational and valued.

CHANGE TO 2026 SPECIAL OFFERINGS

In 2024, the 226th General Assembly approved several changes to the churchwide Special Offerings to be effective January 1, 2026. The changes were recommended by the Presbyterian Mission Agency Board through the Special Offerings Review Task Force.

In 2026, there will be three PCUSA special offerings rather than four:

- One Great Hour of Sharing
- World Communion Offering
- Christmas Joy Offering

The Pentecost Offering will be discontinued after 2025. All current recipient causes, however, will continue to be funded through the churchwide Special Offerings. Ministries focused on children-at-risk, youth, and young adults will now be part of the Christmas Joy Offering.

The Peace & Global Witness Offering will transform into the World Communion Offering. A new grant program will be introduced to support local and regional ministries with the causes supported through this new Offering.

Overall, causes, rather than programs will receive funds as determined by leadership. However, this does not mean currently funded programs will no longer receive funding.

One Great Hour of Sharing will support disaster, hunger, poverty, climate change, immigration, migration, and refugee causes.

World Communion Offering will support racial justice, gender justice, peacemaking, global witness, ecumenical and interfaith relations causes.

Christmas Joy Offering will support children-at-risk, youth and young adults, leadership development for

people of color, Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color, and servants of the Church in need through the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions.

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

The phone tree will be activated, and an email will be sent to the members. LENT COMES EARLY THIS YEAR

Lent runs from Ash Wednesday, February 18th through Holy Saturday, April 4th as we wait in the tomb with Jesus. As we have done for years, we will kick off Lent with a party before we descend with Jesus into the hallows of Lent. So, save the date for Shrove Tuesday or Mardi Gras on February 17th, where we will enjoy a King's Cake, before we begin our Lenten fast of celebrations for 40 days. Look for our weekly announcements for the times of our Lenten schedule.

In terms of our educational emphasis, we are thinking about a Lenten journey to discuss what we think happens after we die. Since Lent is the time to embrace dying to ourselves alongside our Suffering Servant, this could be the perfect time to look at our mini deaths before our death and what we what we know from scripture. It is not as straight forward as you think but one thing is for sure: "whether we live or die, we are always the Lord's." One thing we do know is that both are necessary and happen whether we will it or not. This might be another opportunity for us to surrender to God in this wilderness together.
